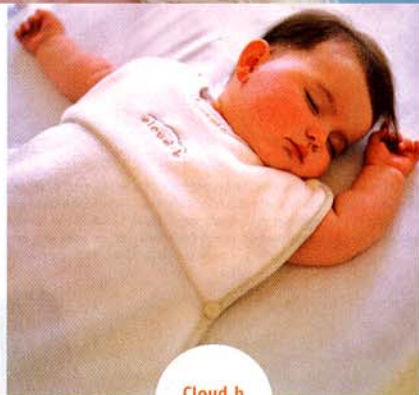

Because of this, they work closely with the UK's Foundation for the Study of Infant Deaths to help keep babies safer at night. Their bags come in a wide range of sizes and styles (including organic). The Bright Stripe Travel grobag featured here has a two-way zipper, so you can unzip a section in the legs and use it with a car seat or stroller. Cloud b Lullabag

Cloud b's adorable Lullabags are the perfect way to help newborns sleep better. They have a dual-headed zipper that begins at baby's neck and zips all the way down the side and across the bottom, so you can unzip the bag from either direction. This means you can do a quick diaper change on your little snoozer without having to unzip her all the way. She'll stay warm and

(hopefully!) asleep through the whole thing. Lullabags come in fleece (\$24) or super-soft cotton (\$27), and you can order them at www.Cloudb.com.

Kushies Sleep Blanket

Known for their high-quality products and fun baby styles, Kushies Baby also makes a line of wearable sleep blankets. Their cozy-soft cotton blankets are designed with safety and practicality in mind. They zip around the bottom and have a zipper protector and shoulder straps, so it's easy to get baby in and out of the blanket. The regular cotton blanket retails for about \$18, or you can upgrade your baby to the luxurious sherpa blanket pictured here (about \$32). Find a retailer near you at www.Kushies.com.

Baby in a Bag Minky

If you really want to cradle your baby in comfort, check out the Minky Super Soft Bag from Baby in a Bag. The plush, outer layer keeps baby warm, and the 100% cotton lining is ultra comfy against your

newborn's skin. If you're looking for a cooler bag, try their silk or cotton versions. These bags have a wide, bell-shaped bottom, so your little one has plenty of room to move and stay comfortable. The zippers are designed for easy diaper changing, and they're kept well away from your baby's skin, so he won't ever get pinched. The Minky sells for \$75, the silk bags for \$125 and the cotton versions start at \$25 at www.BabyinaBag.com.
